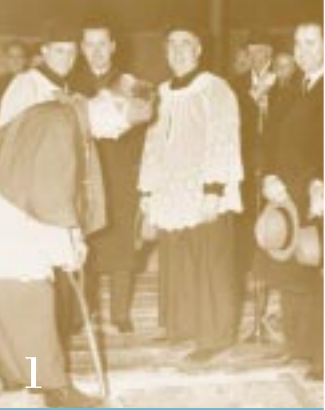

The framework of Christ the King Chapel begins to take shape.

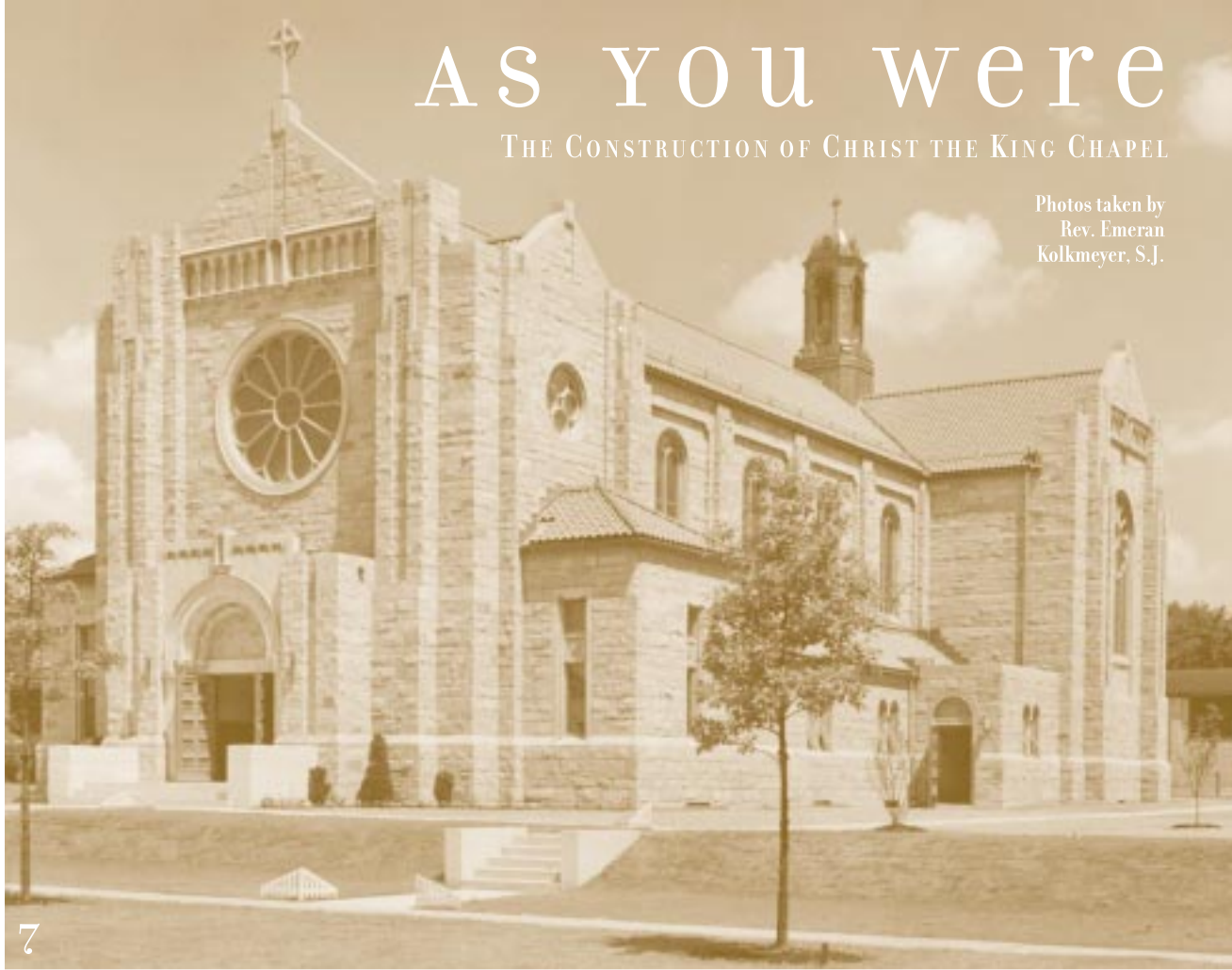
PHOTO 3: SEPTEMBER 7, 1950

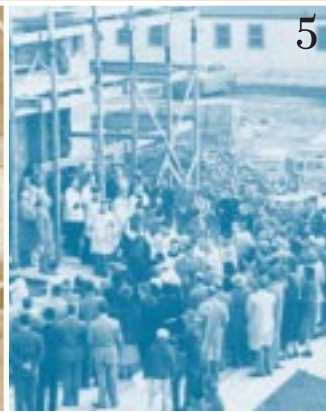

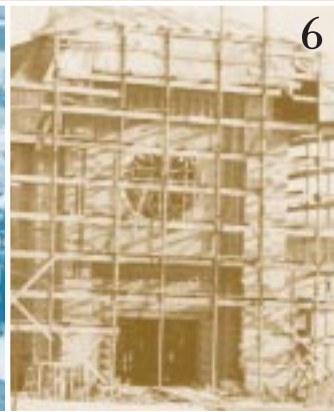
