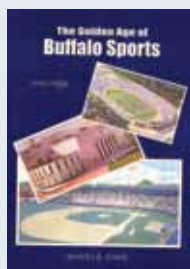


## Starr's New Book Chronicles Buffalo's Golden Age of Sports

## Gress Delivers Keynote Address at UN Global Forum

Edward J. Gress, PhD, professor of accounting, delivered the keynote speech at the first United Nations Global Forum for Responsible Management Education. The two-day forum brought together 260 business school leaders from 43 different countries to discuss how academic institutions can teach a new generation of corporate leaders to value global social responsibility in their work.

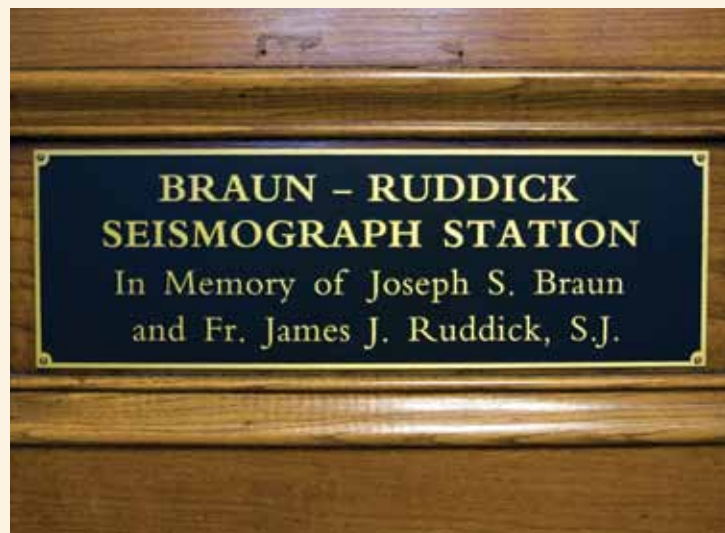

In his address, Gress stated that "The forum could not have occurred at a better time, since the global financial crisis should serve as an impetus to business schools to teach the principles of responsible management education."

Gress is the senior advisor to **Talal Abu-Ghazaleh HON '88**, the deputy chair of the UN Global Compact, and founder and chair of the Talal Abu-Ghazaleh (TAG) Organization. The Jordan-based agency has 70 offices around the world and employs 1,800 multi-disciplined professionals.

Gress is director of the TAG Center for Business Research at Canisius. The center helps support the accounting profession in the Arab world by supplementing those who work in the field with information, research and scholarship aid.
