The Mission & Identity Course Development Grants are competitive. All full-time faculty members in the College of Arts and Sciences, the Richard J. Wehle School of Business, and the School of Education and Human Services are eligible to apply. The grants exist to contribute to the development and implementation of new or substantially revised courses by faculty in the areas of Catholic and/or Jesuit thought with particular emphases on diversity, ethics, global awareness, or justice. Proposals intended for the core curriculum and FYS courses will be given primary consideration. Recipients of the awards are expected to submit a report on their activities to the Deans' and Mission & Identity offices.

The Committee considers the following in its judgment of the merit of proposed projects:

- The pedagogical merit of the project.
- The clarity of the proposal.
- The extent to which the applicant followed the guidelines set out in the application form.
- The extent to which the applicant has demonstrated mutual benefit to the faculty member and to the College.
- The likelihood that the proposed project will result in a new course for the curriculum, in particular the core or FYS courses.

Faculty who will receive a Mission & Identity Summer Research/Publication/Presentation/Performance Fellowship or Dean's Summer Grant during the summer session (s) are not eligible. **Successful applicants will be eligible to apply again in the third year following receipt of an M&I Course Development Grant.**

Please be sure to clearly state the nature, purpose and significance of the proposed work. You should avoid jargon and explain necessary, but specialized, words and phrases.
