Advanced Placement (AP) Credit Equivalencies

The following AP scores and course equivalencies apply to students matriculating in the 2009-2010 academic year. If a score report is not available at the time the initial schedule is made, students will be placed in entry-level courses. Student schedules will be changed once the college receives the score reports. No college credit is granted until official scores are received and evaluated by the Director of Academic Advisement.
