

Scheduling Information for Adolescence Education (Summer 2009)

We offer many scheduling options to provide you with the most convenient and flexible choices, the possibilities are almost endless. You may attend on a full time or part time basis.

Any prospective student can view class scheduling options online. From the Canisius Web site, click on "current students"; then click on "Online Registration/check your grades/view your 1098-T"; then click on "Class schedule" to view current, previous and some future semesters. **Note:** EDAD courses are listed under the subject heading: Adolescence Education, EDU courses are listed under: Teacher Education, EMC courses are listed under: Educ. Middle Childhood.

Sample Schedules for New Students – Summer 2009 (May 18 – July 30)

Monday-Tuesday Program

During the summer, classes meet twice per week on Mon/Tue to complete a course in 5 weeks. During the fall and spring semesters, the Mon/Tue classes meet once per week. A typical schedule is listed below. Many variations are possible.

Session 1 (May 18-June 25)

EDAD 502, section I, 8:30-12 noon
EDAD 535, section I, 12:30-4 pm

Session 2 (June 29-July 30)

*EDU 505, section IIA, 8:30 am-12 noon
EDAD 561-566, section II, 4:30-8 pm

***Business & Marketing candidates** substitute EMC 553, section II, 12:30-4 pm and take EDU 505 during the fall semester.

To complete the master's degree coursework in two semesters, add EDAD 534, section I, 4:30-8 pm for most certification areas (i.e., math, English, etc.). Business & Marketing candidates add EDU 505, section IIA, 8:30 am-12 pm or EDU 505 WEB.

If classes are closed while attempting to register, contact the Graduate Education Office at 888-2545 or 800-950-2505. In most cases, we can add you to a closed section or recommend an alternate schedule to meet your needs.

Friday-Saturday Scheduling. Courses overlapping w/Childhood Education may be taken on Friday or Saturday (i.e., EDU 505). However, there is not a program in Adolescence Education to take 5 courses on a Friday-Saturday schedule.

Web Option: Students may limit their travel to campus by taking online courses to complete coursework requirements for certification. EDU 505 is the only course available online this summer. Beginning in the Fall 2009, EDU 505, EDAD 534 and EDAD 535 are scheduled to be available online.

EDAD 537: Advanced Methods is scheduled the term prior to student teaching. The course consists of 100 hours of field experience in a secondary classroom and evening seminars. Evening seminars are conducted on Tuesday for US students and Thursday (in Ontario) for Canadian students.

Certification coursework can be completed in 2 semesters by completing four courses each semester. Student teaching placements may be completed during the third semester. Student teaching is conducted Monday-Friday during the fall or spring semesters. Student teaching can not be completed during the summer.
