

Scientists to Assemble For A. C. S. Convention

Results of months of local planning will bear fruit next week as the 121st National Meeting of the American Chemical Society convenes at the Hotel Statler in Buffalo. Many of the nation's foremost minds will present papers covering virtually every branch of chemical science.

Among those presenting papers from the Western New York area is Dr. Robert H. Schuler of the Canisius College Chemistry Department. Dr. Schuler will collaborate with Mr. Chester Chmiel, a former Canisius graduate student, presently attending Cornell University, in submitting a joint endeavor. Their paper, entitled "Gas Production in the Photolysis of Liquid Methyl Iodide," will be given before the Division of Physical and Inorganic Chemistry.

Dr. Norman Gaylord of the Evening Division Organic Department will treat of the "Kinetics of the Peroxide Catalyzed Polymerization of Allyl Compounds."

Canisius alumni also presenting research papers are Mr. Nelson Cantwell, '45, who is currently attending Fordham University, and Mr. Walter L. Kosiba, '43, who recently received his Doctorate from Ohio State University.

As a special feature of the week long convention, a series of trips will be conducted to selected plants, laboratories and schools, including the Canisius Seismological Observatory.

Dr. Schuler will act as Meeting Room Chairman, while Mr. A. V. Signeur, also of the Chemistry Department, will be the assistant chairman on the Personnel Committee.
