THE SUMMER OF '73

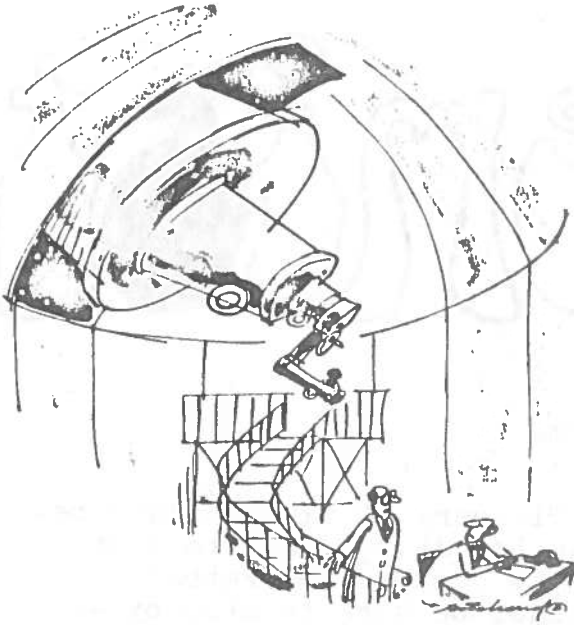

beautiful day for the A.C.S. touch football game in the quad.

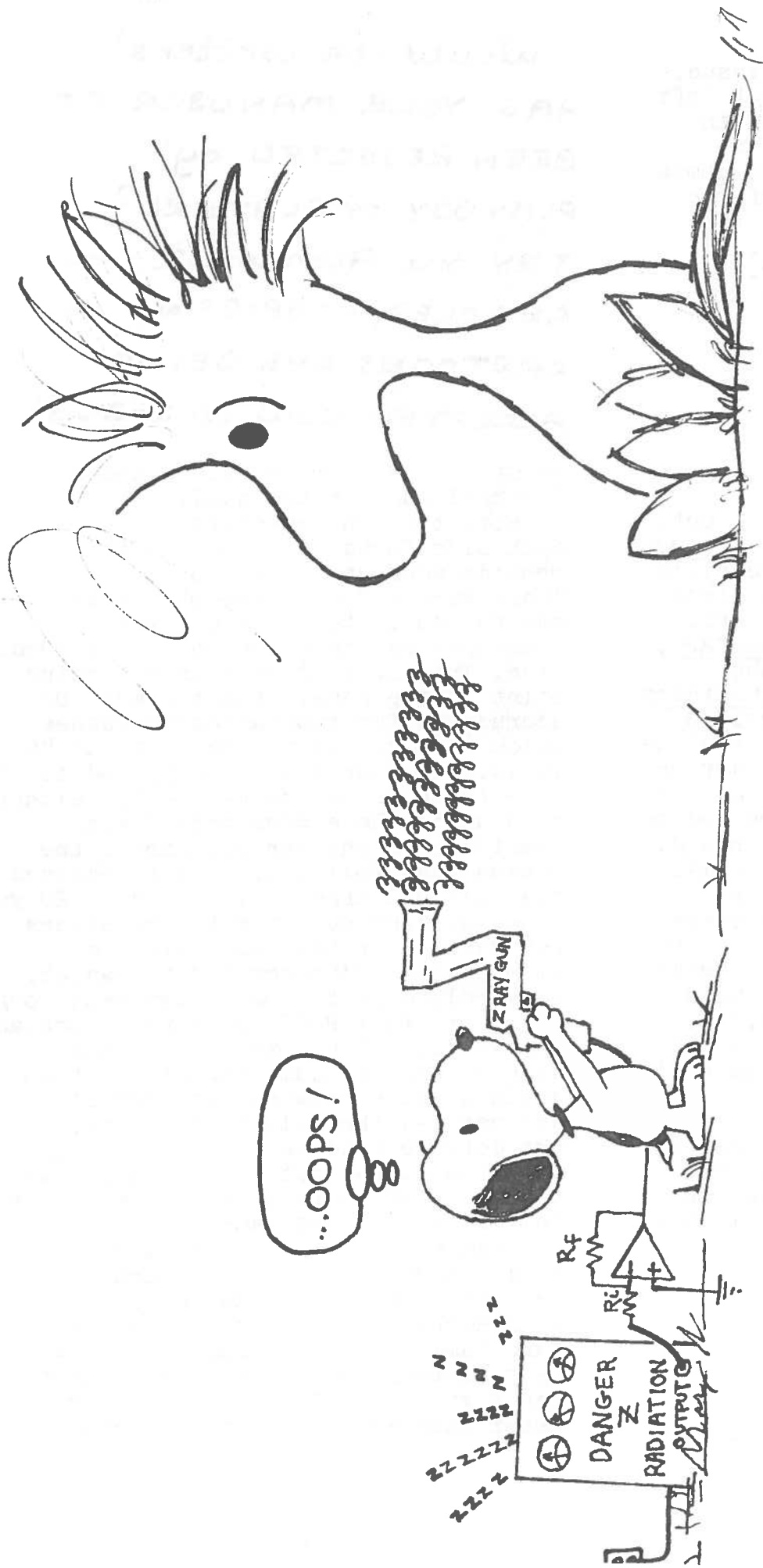
