Gas Chromatographic Separation of Prime Matter from Substantial form

Among the notable achievements in gas chromatography within the last year has been the discovery in our laboratories of the possibility of separating prime matter from substantial form. These two elements, which, though discovered by philosophers, have very real existence as has been amply proven in our course in metaphysics.
